 At an early age, Bob Pirner began learning how to walk in the Lakota Way. The people of Spring Creek Community shared freely with him of their knowledge and their spirituality. From them, he learned the value of courage, fortitude, generosity and wisdom. Those traits have followed his non-profit career through capital campaigns, strategic plans, and the myriad of issues facing a leader. He has founded four nonprofit organizations in addition to being an executive role with several others.







 Growing up in Grand Rapids Michigan Craig Greening wanted to be a teacher, and after graduating from Northern Michigan University, he ended up teaching Industrial Arts at Tohatchi High School New Mexico on the Navajo Nation. Life events lead him to West Virginia where he began his walk with nonprofits. He has held CEO or senior level management positions throughout his NFP career. He has spurred significant growth and increased mission at every turn. "I'm not sure I've ever been a great leader, but I have accomplished the goals I created for both myself and the organizations I worked in."






